OCTOBER MISSION OF THE MONTH

The Mission of the month for October at Grace Lutheran Church is Sharing and Caring Hands. The guiding principle states that Sharing and Caring Hands is dedicated to the proposition that the community can make a difference in the lives of others through volunteerism, donation and commitment, and that this can be accomplished without creating an expensive bureaucracy that saps the resources necessary to carry out its vision and achieve its goals. S & C Hands serves over 157,000 meals each year to people in need. S&CH provide bathing facilities to people with no other access to take care of hygiene needs. They also provide dental care to low or no income children and adults.


Your generosity allows Sharing and Caring Hands to help thousands of individuals and families with emergency needs for health expenses, food, clothing, shoes, travel expenses, job related costs and much more. S&CH provides 3,300 beds to adults and children that would otherwise be sleeping on the floor. Mary's Place Transitional Shelter houses over 600 people each night of which 400 are children.

It is important to note that 91% of money donated goes to the needs of the poor. Please prayerfully consider making a donation to this organization reaching out in Christian love to our neighbors in need. They helped change the beginning of the chorus from "Here I am, Lord; here I stand, Lord" to what we sing today, "Here I am, Lord; is it I, Lord?".

As we don't know the ramifications of our efforts, how they affect others, so with Mr. Schutte who in writing a song for a friend, created a meaningful hymn that has won accolades throughout the world.

President's Message

We are enjoying the lovely late summer early fall weather we love in Minnesota! It's nice to see the colors change and the more moderate weather. It's good to be back together worshipping.

The Church Council held a Planning Retreat on September 18. We combined the retreat with our September Council Meeting. During the retreat, Adeline provided a devotion and discussion around some of the issues related to "compassion fatigue" which is defined as the physical and mental exhaustion and emotional withdrawal experienced by those who care for sick or traumatized people over an extended period of time. It can relate to health care providers, teachers, service workers. It can also relate to the volunteers in the church who often are the same people who are asked to do so many activities. We need to be sensitive to the many around us who have been working hard to serve others during the Pandemic.

Grace needs more people to get involved. Please let members of Council know if you are interested in any of the committees. We talked about getting many of the good ideas into an action plan now that we are beginning to see hope beyond the pandemic. We need to be mindful of the Parable of the Talents. God expects us to be good stewards of the talents and resources provided to us. We are the church!

We reviewed the following topics during the council meeting.

- Enlighten Academy Update began the Phase I of painting and cleaning carpets. They have painted the hallways and ceiling. They are wiring for internet and technology use. No additional work will be done until next June. Enlighten will be paying \$1200 in rent for the year. We will have ongoing use of the spaces for Sunday School and other activities.
- Council voted to accept the Worship & Music proposal to reconfigure the Choir Director position and create a Director of Music Ministries. A search for that position will begin soon.
- We reviewed a Property Management report on the many facility needs required to sustain our building. The 60+ year-old building is showing its age. Property Management continues to prioritize the work that is needed while fielding the day-to-day issues of maintaining the building.

Please continue to pray for the church, the leadership, and our community. Thank you.
