NOVEMBER MISSION OF THE MONTH

It is not a coincidence that we use this mission in November when most of us are celebrating Thanksgiving and indulging in feasts. It is a reminder that many of God's people all over the world including the United States often do not have enough or anything to eat.

ELCA World Hunger creatively and courageously works toward a just world where all are fed. More than 820 million people- that's about 11% of people in the world today- are hungry. As members of the ELCA we are called to respond.

Music Notes: Thankful Hymns

November 25th this year we not only celebrate Thanksgiving but also a Feast Day acknowledging the hymn writer Isaac Watts who died on November 25, 1748. If you look on page 1193 of our hymnbook, you find he wrote the texts to 10 of our hymns, including the words to the Christmas carol, "Joy to the World" as well as "Jesus Shall Reign", "O God, Our Help in Ages Past", and "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross". He couldn't attend Oxford or Cambridge because at that time, you needed to be Anglican, whereas he was part of the non-conformist movement, a popular English Protestant movement.

Similar to Martin Luther, Watts wrote poems and lyrics which were not direct translations of the psalms. Earlier English theologians believed that only direct translations of the psalms should be sung in church . This is what he had to say about that: "To see the dull indifference, the negligent and thoughtless air that sits upon the faces of a whole assembly, while the psalm is upon their lips, might even tempt a charitable observer to suspect the fervency of their inward religion." Watts wanted the psalms to be more relevant to Christianity. For instance, "O God, Our Help in Ages Past" is actually Watt's way of presenting the beginning of Psalm 90 i.e. Before the mountains were brought forth, or the land and the earth were born, from age to age you are God became Before the hills in order stood or earth received its frame, from everlasting you are God, to endless years the same. Watts paraphrased all 150 psalms, though we sing only a fraction of them.

Not all of Watts' hymns are based on psalms. "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross" actually is based on Galatians 6:14; "Come, Let Us Join Our Cheerful Songs" has references to Revelations 5:11-13. No wonder his nickname is "Father of English Hymnody".

President's Report

We are renewed by the bright, colorful, sunny days of fall. We are renewed by the protection we have available from Covid. We are thankful for many things. We are thankful for family and friends. We are thankful for vaccines. We are thankful that, as a caring community, Grace is observing masking and social distancing. There is much we know about Covid but more that we need to learn. Continuing to be cautious and vigilant is important to maintain health and safety for all.

Metropolitan Council Gold Line Bus Rapid Transit Project (GBRT)

Grace Lutheran received a letter from the Metropolitan Council and the Minnesota Department of Transformation regarding research on property that will be needed for the construction of the planned GBRT project which includes our property. Metro Council and MnDOT representatives attended the October Council meeting to discuss what this means for our property. The project will start in January 2022 and conclude in January 2027. Construction is estimated to begin July 2022. We will continue to discuss impact on Grace Lutheran and provide regular updates as the project begins.

Enlighten Academy Update

Enlighten Academy received several donations from Edmentum via Bridging Project Management, LLC. These include tables, chairs, whiteboards, shelving, video monitors and cards, and Chrome Books. They continue to do painting and cleaning. They have installed internet connectivity in the basement. The Academy plans several outreach events in the fall and winter including connecting with the apartments in the neighborhood. They plan an Open House January 15th at Grace.

2022 Budget Information Meeting

The Council reviewed the 2022 Budget proposal from the Business Management Committee to be presented for Congregational approval at the Annual Meeting November 14th. We will hold an information meeting following the service November 7th.

Circle of Welcome

This is a program rolled out by Lutheran Social Services about 5 years ago intended to support Refugee resettlement efforts in Minnesota. Refugee families arrive in the U.S. legally after being forced to flee violence and persecution. Once families arrive in Minnesota, LSS Refugee Services works to secure safe and affordable housing for them. Many refugees live in the Eastside neighborhood of St. Paul! The neighborhood offers cultural resources along with affordable housing.

Part of welcoming families to their new home is helping them build connections to their community. That's where Circle of Welcome comes in, offering transformative, neighborly support for families during the challenges of resettlement. The impact of many different neighbors coming together to walk alongside a newly-arrived family is truly life-changing.

The Community Connections Committee at Grace would like to be involved with this effort in some way. Becoming a partner congregation requires a commitment of 6 months and a financial donation as well. We can be as close or as distant as we wish.


