December Mission of the Month

The Mission of the Month for December at Grace is Houses for Haiti. H for H is a non-profit organization dedicated to building houses for homeless families living on the streets of Cite Soleil, the poorest slum in the Western Hemisphere. With no jobs, education or public assistance, many families have no hope for ever living in a concrete dwelling. H for H believes that every person deserves to live in a safe environment free from disease and filth that is ever present on the streets of Haiti.

Houses for Haiti's goal is to raise enough money each year to build one or two homes. With your help this is possible.

The organization was founded in April 2008 by 2 sisters from Arlington Hills Presbyterian Church in St. Paul. With the assistance of Pastor Leone Dorlean in Cite Soleil who will select one of two deserving families each year who have been living on the streets. Pastor Leone contracts with local builders (putting money back into the local economy) and mission teams will paint the homes. Only 2% of funds raised goes to administrative fees. All staff are volunteers.

Music Notes from our Organist -

There are lots of ways being heralded as able to relieve stress. One way for a musician is to improvise. Bruce Neswick, a wonderful organist and improviser, recently said, "Improvising is never having to say you're sorry." It's a lot of fun and much easier than all the decision making when writing down the music.

One composer that we just celebrated was J. S. Bach who was known in his time more for his improvising than his compositions. It took approximately 100 years for his music to be recognized as outstanding. Another composer known for his improvising was Cesar Franck, whose 200th birthday will be marked on December 10th. He did the same thing as Bach, travelling around the country improvising and showing what sounds organs could create. At that time, the organ was going through a transformation, becoming closer to the type of organ we have today i.e. the pedalboard expanded to 30 notes and different sounds (stops) were being created. Interestingly, he had to become a French citizen before he could be appointed to teach at the famous Paris Conservatory. He thought he was French already, because his father had gotten his citizenship years earlier when Cesar was young, but because he was born in what is now Belgium, he needed to go through the process also.

Even though Franck wrote music in every genre, his organ music in particular set a new standard. ,Rollin Smith, a Franck authority, says his organ music was "the most important organ music written since Mendelssohn's."

At the choral service on December 18th, we will be singing two of his choral works—the famous "Panis Angelicus" and his setting of "Psalm 150". In addition "Noel Breton", one of his short organ pieces, will be played. Trivia: Franck's hands were so big that they spanned an octave and a half, 12 white notes!

The Giving Tree (a Grace tradition) will be going up in the Good Shepherd Lounge on Sunday, November 27th. We are doing things a little differently this year. We will be collecting cold weather clothing items for the students at Daytons's Bluff Elementary school. It is hard to believe that in Minnesota many students arrive at school with no hat, socks, mittens or even sweater or jacket. On the tree you will find paper ornaments (special thanks to Linda Denson) with items needed for the children, please take 1, 2 or as many as you would like, purchase the item and place unwrapped under the tree. We will see that they are delivered to the school. These items will be disbursed as needed prior to Christmas vacation as well as all season as long as they last. Gifts need to be under the tree by December 11 to allow delivery time.

What a great way to celebrate the birth of our Lord, Jesus Christ! Spreading the love of God to our local neighbors and helping them to ward off the cold this winter!!

Report from the Annual Meeting

Update on Land Appraisal. Grace has received an appraisal from Shenehon for the Gold Line Land Acquisition. The appraisal was for twice the amount that Met Council was offering. The GLC Appraisal has been sent to the Met Council. This could probably go three different ways: Met Council accepts the GLC Appraisal, they counter with a lower amount, or we go to court to negotiate an amount. Met Council will pay \$5000 towards the second opinion.

Update on LSS Families Together Plans. Grace met with representatives from LSS Families Together to discuss next steps on the proposed Trauma Day Care. Fund raising at the St. Paul Synod will continue to May 2023. LSS is depended on the amount raised in the capital campaign to support the Day Care. We discussed the issues related to having the church be zoned for a school. We will go back to the congregation when a final decision to locate is made. Meanwhile, lease agreements will be under reviewed.

The Council Stewardship Subcommittee. Peter Hultgren, Adeline Marquart, Monique McClure Hegge, and I, presented during the four Sundays of the Stewardship Campaign. Each presented a Temple Talk about their topic of Stewardship; Gifts of Abundance, Change and Taking Risks, God's Boundless Love, and Called to be Earthkeepers. Kate Pray helped edit the Time & Talent form. Thanks to all who helped with these efforts. Thanks to those who helped with food and serving at the Annual Meeting. Thanks to the congregation for your response to Commitment Sunday Time & Talent and Financial Giving.

The Congregation voted to accept the 2023 Budget. They elected new council members: Linda Sackreiter for President and Amanda Christie and Jeff Gorton for Council members at large. Audit, Endowment and Nominating Committees all have new members elected by the Congregation. We thanked the outgoing council members, Kate Pray, Peter Hultgren, and Linda Baer. We will invite the new Council members to the December Council meeting. We provided updates on the Land Appraisal Review and the LSS Project, Families Together.

Report from Council - Council approved the repair bills for the heating system issues, air handling and exhaust. We discussed the recent security issues in the parking lot and in the building. We will add more security cameras and request that the police patrol the area on Sundays. We will update information on this.

It is with great gratitude that I thank the congregation for supporting the leadership of Grace during these past four years. It has been a tumultuous time where the leadership team had to deal with much uncertainty due to the pandemic and civil unrest while navigating to support the worship, mission, and service of the congregation. We were flexible, adaptable, and resilient during these tough times; adding a security system, a health and safety protocol, improved air quality, online and parking lot services. We persevered. We need to commit to continued perseverance as we move forward. We are called to love God and our neighbors. Blessings for 2023. Linda Baer, Congregation President
