
We believe that God has a purpose for us in this time and place. I am excited to see what the future holds and how we will be changed as we embrace all that God's imagination has in store for our congregation.



#### Music Notes -

Sometimes it takes a while for things to grow. We know that because we live in a state where we wait impatiently for Spring to come so we can begin our planting. And then we wait for the first sprouts to shoot through the moist dirt. And all that takes a lot of patience.

It took over ten years for Bart Millard to write his song "I Can Only Imagine". Russ sang that song on Music Sunday, May 21<sup>st</sup> during communion. Bart Millard's Dad died of cancer when he was only nineteen. Many people commented to him that his dad was now in a better place. He kept thinking about what they said, writing down "I Can Only Imagine" as his response—just that phrase and nothing more.

Ten years later, Bart had formed a band named MercyMe. They were working on recording an album which later was titled "Almost There". He found an old workbook with lots of scribbled notes, including the phrase "I Can Only Imagine". Ten minutes later he had written his now famous song, but it took ten years for it to mature and grow.

A few weeks ago, The Hymn Society held a panel discussion on what should hymn composers write next. They threw out the question and I'm passing it on to you: What topic should hymn composers tackle next? We brought up such topics as the environment, poverty, homelessness, mental health issues and violence, but is there anything else that you can think of that I can pass along to them? Let me know what you think. FYI: One of our favorite hymn composers was on that panel—Marty Haugen.


