Dear family and friends of Grace,

The Book of Psalms gives us many images of God and addresses our human journey. There are many favorites among the 150 psalms. Which are your favorites? Here are some well - loved examples: Psalm 23 – The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want. Psalm 121 – I lift my eyes to the hills, from where is my help to come? Psalm 22 – My God, My God, why have you forsaken me? Psalm 13 – How long, O Lord? Psalm 150 – Let everything that has breath praise the Lord! Hallelujah! Martin Luther based our Lutheran Hymn A Mighty Fortress on Psalm 46 – God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in times of trouble.

The list could go on and on. I encourage you to read through the Book of Psalms and find the ones you love the best. They speak to us in all seasons of life. When we are filled with joy, fear, sorrow, or loss, the Psalms reassure us that God is with us and holds us in the palm of his hand, lifting us up on eagles' wings, and providing shelter for us as found in Psalm 91.

This August, we will be sharing some of the Psalms in worship and hearing what God's message for us is within them. We will learn to sing a new song in times of trouble, to trust in God's abundant love, and to

rejoice for all that God has done and will do on our behalf.

From Psalm 1 to 150, in this Old Testament songbook, we find comfort, peace, stillness, and joy. The answers to all of our troubles are there in this treasured book. These are the songs of God's people. The tunes may be long gone, but many of them have been set to music for our modern ears. We sing them in our liturgy, at our church camps, and in our homes. Find one to sing today!

#### **AUGUST MISSION OF THE MONTH**

#### Music Notes -

The Hymn Society of the United States and Canada met for their annual conference this year On July 16 through the 19th in Montreal Canada at Mc Gill University. Their theme was "Land, Language and Liberation". Just as we on July 16th recognized the indigenous nations that occupied the land where we now live, the Society thanked the Haudenosaunee and Anishinabeg nations on which McGill University now stands. For 4 days they held seminars concerning hymns from all aspects i.e. writing, singing, promoting. In the evening were hymn festivals. The first evening July 16<sup>th</sup> featured hymns from every corner of the earth, the title being "Christ's Love moves the World to reconciliation and Unity". July 17<sup>th</sup> highlighted Native American hymns composed by Jonathan Maracle. Acknowledging that in Canada not only English is spoken but also French, the 3<sup>rd</sup> festival was "A Celebration of French Language Song". In fact, all texts were written in English and French; hymns on the first night included English as well as French, German and Spanish lyrics. The final hymnfest was quite a celebration: "How Great Thou Art: A Festival of Praise". When you get an assembly of church musicians together, the sound can be deafening.

The Hymn Society's mission statement sums it up for all who create and lead church music: We believe that the holy act of singing together shapes faith, heals brokenness, transforms lives and renews peace". Amen to that!

## **Sunday School Update!**

Summer is here and we hope that all of our families are enjoying the weather and all the joys of God's creation. This past Sunday School year we planted seeds of faith, and they grew some very beautiful flowers, but it doesn't stop here. Sunday School will begin again in September! In honor of all this growth our kids wanted to give back and have decided to take some of their Sunday School offerings given this year and donate to help others grow. We have donated internationally to the ELCA Good Gifts program where they will plant fruit trees in communities that will give them food, shelter, and help with erosion of the land. Locally we have donated to the Minnesota DNR Future Forest Fund, that will plant and protect seedlings to replenish our forests. These are small gifts that will continue to grow and benefit generations to come. Once all the construction around the church grounds are complete, we hope to plant a new tree at Grace, and watch it grow.

Special varieties of fruit trees are known to thrive in the driest of conditions. These low-maintenance trees are an investment in the community that can span generations, protecting the soil from erosion and providing nutritious fruit to children and adults alike.

### Forest facts

Our Minnesota State Forests aren't just beautiful to look at, they play a critical role in our way of life. For example:

- One acre of trees, which is about the size of a football field, produces enough oxygen each year for 18
  people.
- Each year, an acre of trees can remove roughly the same amount of carbon emitted by two cars.
- On a hot day, a tree in full leaf can give off 900 gallons (7,500 pounds) of water vapor into the air, which is equivalent to cooling as much air as six room-size air conditioners.

It seems appropriate at this point in the year to assess our financial position. We are running a deficit on the budget which we expected. It is actually lower than anticipated, however.

That being said, a breakdown of expenses reveals that 86% of outgoing funds are for fixed expenses; salaries, mortgage, insurance and utilities. These are things we have very little control over.

We do have around \$300,000 in gifted funds so we are solvent. We also have rental income from our 2 church partners and are in discussions with LSS regarding their lease and rental payments.

Thank you for your generous and faithful giving! We never take that for granted. God is blessing us as always! We are never alone in this mission.
