Dear family and friends of Grace,

June is here - bringing warm summer days and star-filled nights. There are graduations, weddings, and special occasions on the horizon for many. Maybe you have a trip or two planned. Our <u>summer challenge is to send postcards to church</u> as a way of staying connected and sharing the love of Christ with our church family. Our Sunday School children will be participating as part of their Vacation Bible School this Summer. Let's join them in the fun!

Starting on June 22 and for the rest of the summer, we will begin to <u>harvest</u> the Fruit of the Spirit as we tend to the garden of our lives and that of our neighbors - one fruit at a time.

God has given us an <u>abundant</u> world in which we take delight. Come on the adventure this summer with your church family as we explore a variety of ways to worship and celebrate the Fruit of the Spirit in worship, fellowship, at home, and on the road.

<u>Feeding Our Neighbors</u> - During the Month of June, the mission committee will sponsor a special collection of non-perishable food items to be donated to Merrick Community Center. Cash donations will also gratefully be accepted. The number of visits is on the rise and children will not be receiving free breakfast and lunch for the summer so the need is great.

Any donations are appreciated but here are the top five appropriate items that the community needs. Most of these items Merrick cannot order from the food banks that are the backbone of the food shelf network, therefore any of these items would be greatly appreciated by the diverse community which we serve.

- -Cooking oils and vinegars such as canola oil, olive oil, sesame oil, rice vinegar
- -Spices dried chilies of all varieties, cumin, coriander, garlic, ginger, turmeric, thyme, curry, cloves, nutmeg, sage and any other.
- -Cooking sauces Tamari or generic soy sauce, fish sauce, Tamarind paste, fermented bean pastes, chili pastes, coconut milk, oyster sauce, or any broth and sauce.
- -Proteins Almond butter, cashew butter, spam, tuna, canned chicken, smoked salmon, sardines or any other shelf stable proteins.
- -Grains Jasmine rice, basmati rice, apple bran sweet rice, artisan egg noodles, rice noodles, soba noodles, fours or any other grains.

Music Notes -


Did you take a foreign language in high school? It probably was French or Spanish, possibly German or Latin. It broadened your perspective of the English language, seeing where words originated and how grammar differs from one culture to another. It also showed what a challenge it is to take one word in one language and need a bunch to accommodate another. For example, in English the word skyscraper literally translates to cloud scratcher in German (Wolkenkratzer).

Many of our favorite hymns that form the foundation of Lutheran hymnody were written in German, nineteen of those in our hymnal being translated into English by one woman -Catherine Winkworth. An English woman, born in 1827 and dying suddenly of heart failure at the age of 50, took on that task. We have 19 of her translations in our hymnal; she actually translated almost 400. She also wrote several books concerning hymn composers.

What is just as interesting is her involvement with English social issues. You've probably read a book or two by the English author Charles Dickens. Perhaps you've seen a movie, musical or play such as A Christmas Carol or Oliver (Twist)? They bring to light the class system England had during the mid-1800's. Catherine Winkworth not only spent time translating German hymns, but fighting for human rights and acceptable living conditions. Do you recall in Mary Poppins the mother was going to a protest demonstration concerning women's rights? Winkworth was also very active in that movement, not only promoting equality but more education opportunities for women.

The next time we sing one of your favorite hymns, look at the bottom left side where they mention the person(s) who wrote the tune and the text. It may also mention a Britisher by the name of Catherine Winkworth who helped bring the text to light.

Come Be a Part of the Worship Team! Part 3

Here are descriptions for each opportunity to join the Worship Team.

Greeters - all ages, arrive by 9:10, greet people at the lower level before the service

Ushers – all ages, arrive by 9:10, hand out bulletins, gather offering, help direct Communion, tidy Sanctuary after worship

Acolyte – all ages (with adult assistance if younger than 5^{th} grade), arrive by 9:15, robe for festival services, light candles before the service, assist with communion during service, extinguish candles at end of service,

Lay Reader - all ages, arrive by 9:15, read the scripture lesson during worship

Liturgist - Confirmed members, arrive by 9:15, robe for most services, assist with leading the service, help serve Communion

Communion Assistant - Confirmed members, arrive by 9:20, robe for festival services, assist serving communion during service

Money Counter - Confirmed member, count offering money after the service

Chancel Care Assistant - all ages (with adult supervision if younger than 5th grade), after the service, assist in tidying up the altar area, putting away communion ware.


Sunday Fellowship Treats Provider – all ages (with adult participation), set up treats before the service, including making coffee, serve treats during Fellowship following the service, clean up after Fellowship time.

There will be specific instruction given for each position.

Accommodations can be made for all abilities. Examples: Lay Readers can read from the floor, or the pew instead of the lectern. Communion Assistants can sit or stand behind a tray on a table while "saying the words" to serve communion. Ushers may sit while handing out bulletins.

Sign up sheets can be found on the island in the Narthex, the music sign up is on the Kiosk and the fellowship sign-up is in the South Tower room. Please prayerfully consider how you can serve, and SIGN UP! We need you!
